QUESTION 1

Using the above sentence and any **three** others of your own, explain the functions played by Noun Phrases (NPs) and Verb Phrases (VPs) in sentences. [20 marks]

QUESTION 3

Demonstrate the syntax-semantics interface by showing that syntactic elements (noun, verb, adjective and adverb for instance) have distinct roles in syntax which change when one considers their thematic/semantic roles.

QUESTION 4

Study the following words and then answer the questions that follow.

dear, light, bear, dull, bright

(a) Group the words according to their semantic relations and justify your classification.

(b) Using examples from the list of words above, explain the semantic issue raised by homonyms and polysemous words. [10 marks]

QUESTION 5

Study the following ambiguous sentences and answer the questions which follow.

- (i) The burglar threatened the student with the knife.
- (ii) Visiting relatives can be boring.
- (iii) John found his wallet near the bank.
- (iv) Peter informed the warden about the burglary at their hostel. He was so upset about it.
- (a) Identify and explain the type of ambiguity found in each of the sentences above. [8 marks]
- **(b)** Using your own examples, explain why ambiguity is both a syntactic and semantic issue.
