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- The Documentary hypothesis has been used, since the time of Julius Wellhausen, to explain the origins and formation of the Pentateuch, by many students of the Old Testament. However, for a while now, several students of the Old Testament have argued that it is inappropriate and/or inadequate to account for the formation of the Pentateuch.
  - a. Unpack the meaning of the term 'Pentateuch' [20]
  - b. Provide a brief summary of the classical documentary hypothesis, as proposed by Julius Wellhausen. [40]
  - c. Examine the usefulness and adequacy of the Documentary Hypothesis in addressing issues that arise from the Pentateuch. [40]
- 2. Yehezkel Kaufmann (cited in Brill and Leiden, 2011) categorised the report of the history of ancient Israel in Joshua to 2 Kings as 'historiosophy'.
  - a. Expose your understanding of the meaning of 'historiosophy. [20]
  - b. How would you relate this proposal of Kaufmann to the M. Noth's proposal of the 'D' historian. [30]
  - c. Discuss how M. Noth's theory of the 'D' historian may be used to interpret the books of Joshua to 2 Kings. [50]
- 3. 'Prophetic Literature is the written word which attests to and grows out of the activities of ancient Israel's prophets.' (cf. David L. Petersen, 2012).
  - a. Describe your understanding of this statement [20]
  - b. In the light of your response to (a) discuss your view of how this prophetic literature was put together, preserved and transmitted. [30]
  - c. Comment on the assertion that prophetic literature gives an alternative view of the causes of the destruction of Jerusalem and the temple by the Babylonians.
- 4. The nomenclature, 'Wisdom Literature' has been used to categorize a number of books and passages in the Old Testament that share certain themes and literary styles.
  - a. Expose your understanding of the term 'Wisdom Literature' as it is used in Old Testament Studies; [20]
  - b. Citing examples, discuss the main themes and characteristics associated with this literature; [40]
  - c. Examine the relevance and usefulness of the term 'Wisdom Literature' in Old Testament studies. [40]

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
