 - c) With the aid of examples, demonstrate the usefulness and relevance of the theological interpretation of the Old Testament in your context. [50]

 - a) Analyse the current position of Old Testament scholars concerning the use of the Old Testament as a source of normative and applied ethics among Christians. [40]
 - b) Discuss how the Old Testament may continue to be used as a source for ethical decisions, and how contemporary assumptions and theories of ethics maybe used in the interpretation of the Old Testament. [60]

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
