Three ecumenical councils, which convened immediately after the first two mentioned above are the First Council of Ephesus (431), the Council of Chalcedon (451) and Second Council of Constantinople (553).
  - a) Give a critical summary of the deliberations at the latter three councils mentioned above. [20]
  - b) From your summary in a) above isolate what you would consider as the main theological issue from the three ecumenical councils and discuss its importance to the development of the theology of the Christian faith. [40]
  - c) What position would you take on this theological issue and why? [40]

  - a) Give an analysis of the challenges women faced during medieval period with special reference to Joan of Arc and Catherine of Sienna. [30]
