- Discuss the link between HIV/AIDS in sub-Saharan Africa and how masculinities are constructed. Use specific examples to support your answer.
- "62% of people infected by HIV in Zimbabwe are women" (Government of Zimbabwe, 2015). Paying particular attention to the role of patriarchy and migration, analyse the feminization of the epidemic.
- "Gender is a central category of social theorizing and debate in postcolonial Africa". Examine what you consider to be the key challenges facing gender studies in contemporary African scholarship.
- Assess the impact of globalisation on African societies (15 marks). Comment on the view that the idea of a "global society" is sociologically impossible (5 marks).
- Using examples, examine the view that masculinities are plural and historically specific.
- Write an essay on what you consider to be the causes of xenophobia in Africa today.
