Question 1

- iv) Violence against women,
- v) women and armed conflict,
- vi) Women and the economy,
- vii) Women in power and decision making,
- viii) Institutional mechanisms,
- ix) Human rights of women,
- x) Women and the media,
- xi) Women and the environment,
- xii) The girl child
