### **Question 1**

Read the following case and answer the questions following it.

### Financial Inclusion for Sustainable Smallholder Agriculture

"Access to finance is a cross-cutting issue affecting smallholder farmers. Farmers require access to finance to purchase the requisite inputs, purchase and or hire mechanization services and to invest in post-harvest storage and market linkage technologies. However, access to adequate, appropriate and affordable formal financial services among smallholder farmers is a general challenge in Zimbabwe. The general perception is that smallholder farmers are too costly and risky to serve and the sector does not present a compelling business case to invest in. Consequently, many smallholder farmers rely on informal financial sources, microfinance institutions and rural community financial institutions for finance. These institutions and banks often lack the capacity, sectoral knowledge and capital required to lend to agriculture".

As an agribusiness research consultant, you have been commissioned by the Ministry of Lands, Agriculture, Fisheries, Water, Climate and Rural Development to conduct a comprehensive study in the wake of lower access to formal finance by smallholder farmers in Zimbabwe.

#### Required:

- a) State an appropriate research title for the research. [3]
- b) Formulate the statement of the problem for the study. [4]
- c) "A research problem exists only if some conditions are met". With reference to the research problem and the statement of the problem you provided above, highlight three salient features of a good statement of the problem.
- d) Formulate three possible research objectives for the proposed study. [6]
- e) Discuss whether a positivist or pragmatist paradigm would provide the best approach for the study and justify the choice of the paradigm. [5]
- f) Develop a conceptual framework for the above problem, clearly indicating the various types of variables.
- g) Identify the target population for your study and briefly describe how you would select the sample for the study. [5]
