Explain the historical links between Kemet/Ancient Egypt and the rest of Africa. Support your answer with relevant examples. [100 marks].

Question 2

Using the following text as a starting point, explain the religious beliefs of the ancient Egyptians. Support your argument with illustrations from the "Origin of ancient Egyptians". [100 marks]

"If African religious beliefs are compared with the orthodox Western Christianity, it becomes apparent that there are little essential differences between them. The book of Genesis starts with: "In the beginning, God created the Heaven and the Earth..." God, the supernatural being, omnipotent and omniscient, was incarnated in Jesus Christ, his son born of Virgin Mary. Christ died for our sins to make atonement for the human race and deliver us unto God. Though dead, his Holy Spirit is ever-present. Between an individual and God were two important intercessors: the pastor and Christ. In Islam, the supreme power is *Allah* and the intercessors are the Prophet Mohammed and the living Ayatollahs and *mullahs*" (Ayittey, 1991).
