- 1. At the meeting in Geneva, Switzerland 1996, September 12<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>, the WCC Central Committee "raised theological issues of HIV / AIDS pandemic in the areas of creation, human nature, the nature of sin and death, Christian hope for eternal life and the role of the church as a body of Christ".
  - a) With relevant illustrations, examine the validity of the assertion that HIV / AIDS is related to the fall of the human being into sin. [50]
  - b) Using your answer in a) above, compare and contrast the problem of sin in relation to the interpretation of "God's judgment". [50]
- 2. Families and the church in Africa face effects of HIV / AIDS that has interfered with the economic and social life of the people.
  - a) Assuming as a pastor one of your members is infected by the HIV but is on denial about the reality of infection, give a critical reflection of the kind of pastoral counselling that you would offer to him/her as a spiritual leader.

- b) Examine five economic and five social challenges that the problem of HIV/AIDS may have caused in your community. [50]

  - b) Using your answer in a) above, assess the extent to which the church's perception of HIV/AIDS leads to any five dilemmas that church finds herself in when addressing HIV/AIDS pandemic. [50]
