It attempts to fashion a reflective space within the ongoing learning practice that would allow the researchers to collate their insights in to larger issues.

Special Edition

This special issue aim to show how gender informs the study of International Relations (IR). What gender is taken to mean, and how gender is employed as a concept, category, variable, approach or as a particular form of critique in International Relations (IR), is tied up with the bigger question of our approach to this field of study: the theoretical or analytical framework that we employ to help us make sense of International relations system. This edition shall provide an opportunity to develop these theoretical issues. It elaborates further on why feminists are mostly resistant to gender essentialism and regard the 'gender as a category' or 'gender as a variable' approaches and as inadequate and ultimately unhelpful. The edition shall also affords some space for contemporary work on gender in International Relations that also tries to get beyond the tendency in feminist theorizing to privilege women as the main focus of research (even as gender is acknowledged to be relational). The emphasis is on the need for a transitional political plan for action that results in a dialogical Gender and International Relations model and practice for political and social development in the world.
